



Digging Deeper Into My Summary Code

Now that you know your three-letter Summary Code is EIR, it is helpful to consider a few other details. As mentioned earlier, the first letter of your code, E, indicates that you resemble the Enterprising type; your second letter, I, indicates the next type you resemble most, Investigative; and your third letter, R, indicates the next type you resemble most. The first two letters of your Summary Code of EIR are opposite on the hexagon. My Education



It is important to think about the type of education and training needed for the careers that interest you.

The earlier you consider the education and training required for potential careers, the sooner you can begin planning. As part of this process, you will also need to consider what type of education and training is right for you.

After reviewing the occupational lists in this report, you will likely be able to see that having a high school diploma may not be enough for some occupations. But a college degree may not be needed, either. Different kinds of work require different types of training and education. For example, some jobs require training in how to operate equipment. Employers want to hire people who are most qualified for a job—and that does not always mean the person with the most education.




