

Using PAR's Zotero Bibliographies

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INTRODUCTION

Bibliographies are invaluable resources for researchers and clinicians. However, they inevitably become outdated as new research emerges after they are published. Online reference managers like Zotero have solved this problem by being continually updated, allowing anyone with internet access to read and share up-to-date bibliographies at any time. Even better—creating an account is free (zotero.org), and researchers can choose to use the online website platform or download the desktop application, which has a more flexible user interface.



USING THE ZOTERO WEBSITE

After creating an account, users may search for and join product- or topic-specific groups. Clicking on the group name takes the user to the group's overview page, the central dashboard of the bibliography, where they can view the group's description and recently added items; access the group's library, which consists of references to the group's resources; and invite colleagues to access the bibliography.


Figure 1. Zotero group overview page for the Personality Assessment Inventory (PAI).

Figure 1 shows the group overview page for the Personality Assessment Inventory (PAI). It's easy to see recent updates because the page lists references in the order they were modified. Each page contains a description of the product and a link to the PAR product web page, so users can easily learn more about or purchase the product they are researching.


Figure 2. Zotero group library page for the Personality Assessment Inventory (PAI).

In the group library view (Figure 2), users can sort the references in a variety of ways, including alphabetically by title, publication, or author (creator); by date added; or by date modified. Users can also export each resource's citation information and view

the resource's title, authors, abstract, and tags. Users can add a reference to their personal Zotero library for future use by selecting the desired reference(s) and clicking the folder icon on the toolbar near the top of the screen.

USING THE ZOTERO DESKTOP APPLICATION

Figure 3 shows the Zotero desktop application view of the PAI group library. The desktop application is the most powerful version of Zotero: It includes all the features of the browser version plus advanced search, interface customization, offline reference management, data syncing, and word processor integration.
