

Introducing the newest member of the Personality Assessment Inventory (PAI) family, the Personality Assessment Screener–Observer (PAS-O), **the ONLY measure of psychopathology normed on informant and self-report discrepancies**. The PAS-O is a 22-item informant report for individuals ages 18 years and older. It is designed to obtain information from an observer (such as a spouse, relative, or close friend) about a client or patient to help screen for a broad range of clinical issues.

A fast, efficient report to complement the PAS or PAI

- **PAS:** When used with the PAS, the PAS-O allows you to gain valuable insight from someone close to the client to help screen for clinical issues and determine the need for follow-up testing.
- **PAI:** If PAS or PAS-O results indicate the need for in-depth testing, the PAI provides information relevant for clinical diagnosis and treatment planning.

PAS-O features and benefits

- Consists of 22 items that are directly parallel to the 22 items on the self-report PAS and corresponding items on the parent instrument, the PAI.
- Suitable for instances when a client is unable to complete the PAS due to confusion, thought disorder, or other limitations.

Why use the PAS-O?

- **Exclusive:** The only informant report compatible with the PAS and the gold-standard PAI.
- **Easy administration:** Requires just two forms—a Response Form and a Score Summary and Profile Form.
- **Quick:** Can be completed in just 5 minutes.
