
Scale	Description		
Atypical (ATY)	Behaviors frequently associated with psychotic disorders (e.g., bizarre beliefs, hallucinations, delusions, self-harm, excessive fears)		
Irritability (IRR)	Persistent and chronic irritability that permeates most aspects of the child's life (e.g., emotional dysregulation, behavioral/emotional outbursts, demandingness)		
Grandiosity (GRAND)	Elevated sense of self and mood (e.g., not taking responsibility for actions, exaggerating, stealing)		
Hyperactivity/Impulsivity (HYPER)	Classic description of overactivity and impulsivity (e.g., difficulty sitting still, acts without thinking about consequences, always on the go)		
Aggression (AGG)	Aggression targeting other people, animals, and/or objects		
Inattention (INATT)	Traditional scale for inattention and distractibility (e.g., difficulty focusing, difficulty sustaining attention)		
Affect (AFF)	Mood changes (e.g., mood disturbances, suicidal ideation, cognitive distortions)		
Social Interactions (SOC)	Ability to interact with peers (e.g., ability to make friends, relate to others, engage in social interactions)


