Note. An Abuse scale cutoff score of 215 will yield approximately twice as many false negatives as false positives. If a less conservative Abuse scale cutoff score is desired, signal detection theory suggests a cutoff score of 166. The cutoff scores selected should be determined by the intended use of the test scores. The CAPI Manual (1980, 1986) provides potential cutoff scores for each scale that represent the upper 5% of the control sample.

A valid, elevated Abuse scale score indicates the examinee has characteristics similar to those of known, active physical child abusers. In the evaluation of a suspected physical child abuse case, an elevated Abuse score indicates the need for additional evaluation data from other sources.

Abuse Special Scales Scores

Note. No cutoff scores were suggested for the Loneliness and Ego-Strength scales in the CAPI Manual (1980, 1986). These special scales were developed to inform the test user about the relative degree of these personality characteristics in respondents.
